

It was with great sadness that we heard that The Queen had passed away at Balmoral Castle, on the 8th September

In 1952 the, then, Princess Elizabeth was in Kenya when she became Queen upon the death of her father King George VI.

Flying immediately back to London, her first step as Queen was at Heathrow Airport. To mark this, an official photograph of the Queen's arrival, with her signature below, hangs on the wall in The Mayor's Office at the Civic Centre.

The Queen visited Hillingdon numerous times.

The earliest occasion may have been in 1941 as Princess Elizabeth, visiting the Battle of Britain Bunker with her father and her sister Princess Margaret. They sat in the royal box and as it



was a private viewing so unfortunately there are no photographs that we know of.

In 1994 Her Majesty opened the Princess Christian Unit at Mount Vernon Hospital.

In 2002 as part of her Golden Jubilee tour of Britain, she visited Uxbridge to unveil a statue and watch performances by local youth arts groups before walking along the High Street, meeting the public.



In 2006 the monarch paid a long visit to Hillingdon. She opened Hillingdon House Farm athletics complex; presented medals to young athletes; had lunch at Brunel University; opened a new health centre; visited the One Stop Shop in Hayes; watched performances by a choir and theatre group; finally walking along Station Road to meet the public.

2010 saw her visit the newly redeveloped NATO Northwood Headquarters.

The Queen visiting Uxbridge in 2002 In 2019 The Queen honoured our Residents' Association with The Queen's Award for Voluntary Service (an equivalent of an MBE). At the presentation we were informed that we may be the only Residents' Association in the United Kingdom to have received such award. The certificate and the crystal award are on permanent display at Fairfield Church.

In June of this year, many of you will have attended the '**Picnic in the Park'** marking the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. This was jointly organised by Northwood Hills and Northwood Residents' Associations. We know the Queen was very pleased to be made aware of the success of the event and the support given by residents from across the borough and further afield.

Our Queen served us all for 70 years, for many of us that's our whole life-time.

In closing, I am pleased to advise that later this year the two Residents' Associations will join together to plant a tree in the memory of The Queen on Northwood Recreation Ground. Rest In Peace.

The New "State of the Art" Health Centre

Work has commenced to refurbish the derelict Northwood & Pinner Cottage hospital site. There is a lot to do and currently it is not expected that the building will be ready for occupancy until 2024.

At that time, the Doctor's Practices will decamp from the existing Health Centre site into the refurbished building.

After that, the existing Health Centre site will be sold, the building demolished and two blocks of flats will be built. Plans for the flats have been approved, but as the Health Centre site is to be sold to a commercial developer, we may see a different set of plans submitted to Hillingdon Council at a future date.



A New Library for Northwood Hills

Many of you will recall that this hugely popular library was refurbished some 10 years ago, along with many other Hillingdon Libraries.



We have been advised that a structural issue has recently been discovered which regrettably means the library will have to come down. But the good news is that it will be rebuilt!

We don't yet know any temporary proposals for users of the library. Nor have we seen any plans for the new building. So, this may not happen for a few months yet. We are monitoring the situation, but until the proposals are published are not able to comment further. We will keep you updated.

Has your High Street bank closed? Did you know that the Post Offices are now acting as banks?

More than 1,000 bank branches have closed in just two years. Many of them our last banks locally.

Royal Bank of Scotland cut 191 branches (10%); Lloyds have shut 180 (15%); Barclays closed 132 (8%). The Co-operative Bank has shut more than half of its branches in two years – 117 (53%). Government-backed NatWest are closing 56 in 2022 alone.

HSBC – which bills itself as the world's local bank – has axed 321 branches since the start of last year, more than a quarter of its network saying, "Overall footfall in our branches has fallen by over 40%, with 93% of transactions now completed by telephone, internet or smartphone, plus 97 per cent of cash withdrawals are made via ATMs."

Enjoy in-person counter service again...

Which? magazine said that while 72% of the people it asked rated their general experience of the Post Office as good or excellent, **41% said they did not realise that it offered banking services.**

The Post Office has secured a 3-year agreement with 30 banks and building societies, for customers to access personal banking services at 11,500 Post Offices across Britain



In these difficult times, our local foodbanks are open to all in need. Here's how it works...



This invaluable service was started by Nigel Newlyn at the United Reformed Church in Joel Street in March 2015. It is open every Tuesday morning from 10am - 12 noon.

Volunteers: There are 7-8 volunteers who work to a flexible rota for their 2 hourly slots, with usually two people per shift. This is one of the less busy facilities, with perhaps 5-6 clients per day. If you would



like to help in any way, contact details are on the website <u>www.urceastcote-nwhills.org.uk</u>

Obtain vouchers: Via Citizens' Advice Bureau or call the Hillingdon Community Hub: **0203 949 5786**. The website also details where to obtain them. <u>www.hillingdon.foodbank.org.uk</u>

Where possible you will also be able to discuss your circumstances to ensure you are getting all the financial support available to you.

Vouchers can then be exchanged at *any* Foodbank to collect your food and other items. Another local foodbank operates from Emmanuel Church in Northwood on Fridays from 11am to 1pm; they also have facilities to offer you hot drinks.

Food bags: Clients can select items from those on display. Alternatively, pre-prepared food bags which have been collected

from the hub (see Donations) are available for Single persons and Families, comprising approximately three days' worth of meals.





Not just food:

Of course, it isn't just food items that people need. Also required are toilet rolls, soap, washing powder, sanitary items and toiletries.

Donations: Hillingdon's scheme operates from a hub at Oxford Road in Uxbridge. Supermarkets are a major source of supply for the hub, including items left in their collection trolleys. Items are either collected from Uxbridge by the volunteers, or donations can also be given directly to URC on Tuesday mornings. Items must be non-perishable and in date. If occasionally any are received which have short or exceeded sell-by dates, these are separated and clearly specified and can be taken in addition to the food parcels.

Most valuable food items: If you'd like to donate, things which whizz off the tables fastest are tinned meat and fish (eg tuna), long-life milk, juice, tea, coffee and sugar. Also, baby formula, toiletries, jams and cereals. Remembering that not everyone has access to cooking facilities, so tins and jars of fruits, vegetables, rice pudding and custards are very welcome.

Dietary requirements: Our foodbanks can usually adapt food parcels to meet individual dietary needs, for example, gluten free, halal or vegetarian.

Our thanks: We should be thankful that the staff generously give their time, local individuals and some businesses generously donate items, and those in a crisis situation are extremely reliant on the availability of essential items.

Our support is very much needed and appreciated.

Microplastics found in human blood

Reported in The Guardian in March 2022

Microplastic pollution has been detected in human blood for the first time, with scientists finding the tiny particles in almost 80% of the people tested.

In a small, but significant survey of 22 donors, scientists analysed blood samples from 22 anonymous donors, all healthy adults and found plastic particles in 17.

- Half the samples contained PET plastic, which is commonly used in drinks bottles
- A third contained polystyrene, used for packaging food and other products. •
- A guarter contained polyethylene, from which plastic carrier bags are made.

The discovery shows the particles can travel around the body and may lodge in organs. The impact on health is as yet unknown, but researchers are concerned as microplastics do cause damage to human cells in the laboratory. It is already known that air pollution particles enter the body and cause millions of early deaths a year.

These tiny particles have been found in the faeces of babies and adults.

Microplastics now contaminate the entire planet, from the summit of Mount Everest to the deepest oceans. And it's not just our oceans that are being affected by microplastics they enter our own food chain via the water and soil we use to grow crops, as well as polluting the air we breathe.



What are Microfibres?

Microfibres are particles of plastic below 5mm in size. Other examples of microplastics include: bits from larger plastic items like bottles and bags that break down; microbeads in cosmetics; Blue man-made fabric fibres have grown into an oyster shell.

One way to help is to eliminate microplastics from our laundry

Washing our clothes is responsible for more than a third of the microplastics that end up in the sea, seriously harming



marine life. A major source is those made from synthetic materials.

Experts say that between 700,000 and 12 million microfibres can be shed during one single load of laundry, "turning our oceans into a big plastic soup"

Microfibre filters for washing machines are being developed. In the meantime, here are some simple eco-friendly steps that we can follow from today, to help save our oceans.

1. Avoid buying man-made fibre clothes. 100% synthetic fabrics release <u>seven times</u> the amount as a polycotton blend. Polyester fleece may be one of the biggest emitters of microfibres. Consider buying a woollen clothing instead. So, avoiding these fabrics is one of the easiest switches you can make.

2. Only wash clothes when they are dirty! Washing clothes less frequently is perhaps the simplest way to help tackle the microplastics problem. It also reduces CO2 emissions and means our clothes will last longer, too. Don't just put the day's clothes straight into the laundry basket. Look for visible marks or "sniff".

3. Spot clean small marks and hang things out to air, rather than wash them to freshen. And embrace the pinny! For messy cooks and jobs, an apron is a great way to keep clothes clean and reduce the amount of washing!

4. Use liquid detergent and mesh washbags. Washing powder scrubs and loosens more fibres. Use a micro-filter washing bag for synthetic items to catch the loose fibres which can be picked out and binned. They may not capture 100% of fibres, but are a good start.

5. Pick cooler, faster cycles. Washes at 15°C for 30 minutes led to a 30% reduction in microfibres released, versus an 85 minute cycle at 40°C. Researchers say that if every household in Europe did this, it could potentially save more than 3,800 tonnes of microplastics from being released a year.

6. Fill your washing machine. A full load is naturally more eco-friendly, it saves both water and energy. Closer packed clothes = less friction between the clothes = less breakage of microparticles.



7. Avoid the "delicates" cycle. A 2019 study found the delicate setting, which uses twice as much water as typical cycles, releases average 800,000 more microfibres per wash.

8. Reduce tumble-drying. *When the sun's out, so should the washing be!* Tumble-drying increases fragility of material and microfibre shedding in the next wash. Of course, it saves energy too. Any lint created should be binned, not put down the drain.

9. Keep clothes for longer and shop second-hand. Research shows that more microfibres are shed in the first eight washes of new cloth. So, hanging onto garments you already own, and buying second-hand items are positive changes you can make. Avoid "disposable fashion". Support charities!

10. Avoid microfibre cleaning cloths. Once hailed as the eco-friendly fix all for cleaning as they reduced the need for harsh cleaning chemicals, but little did we know then that each time we wash our microfibre cloths, teeny tiny bits of plastic are breaking off and ending up in the oceans. Now we do, so it's time to ditch them. Jan C

10 Money Saving Tips

1 Eat your cupboards. Many of us have cupboards full of halfused items, such as packs of pulses, sauces, spices, flour, dried fruit, frozen goods etc. Sort out and pull to the front (or the worktop) all

those items and get inventive with some new recipes to use them up. List a couple of ingredients and search online for recipes. Not only will you save money, but you'll also discover some new ideas and get clearer cupboards to see what you have left to use!

2 Be aware of what you (and all family members) are *really* spending. Consolidate online order baskets *before* ordering and have a weekly review of whether those items are absolutely necessary. If so, consider whether they are replacing an item which can then be sold.

3 Sort out and sell your unused items. If you have never used the likes of eBay to sell items, consider doing so. Vinted specialises in clothing, including babies' clothes. If you don't want to get involved in posting items, go for "buyer collect", or keep it local by advertising items on sites like Nextdoor.in Northwood Hills and adjoining areas.

4 Have a street sale. Make more of an event by **joining with neighbours** to hold a front-garden/garage sale. Promote it on local Whatsapp groups.



5 Review bank accounts. If you are fortunate enough to have savings, check to ensure they have not lapsed into a minimal interest account. Prioritise clearing credit accounts to avoid paying interest.

6 Swap shops and brands. Discount supermarkets have excellent quality items. Try them. And don't forget the charity shops. Don't give them your "rubbish" and they don't sell it either, so are worth a look! Check out school uniform clubs to exchange clothing. Own brands and named are often from the same manufacturers, but with different labelling.

7 Check out www.forums.moneysavingexpert.com fronted by Martin Lewis These next recommendations came from there...



8 Monthly Groceries. "For the first month I took a guess, but I really had no idea how much I was spending. Then, for the first month I saved *all* my receipts (including the ones from the local shop when I ran out of milk)". At the end of the month add them all up see if you were on target with your guess. This gives a chance to really see what things cost and what you might do without.

9 No Spending Craft Challenge. If you've built up a stash of craft supplies, be more creative to combine techniques and use up what you already have in stock. "Every month, I want to finish incomplete projects and turn left-over bits into something else." Get the satisfaction of creating something without buying new materials.



NHRA Sponsorship

Hillingdon is one of the first authorities in the capital to sign-up to this not-for-profit national initiative. The aim is to plant ¼ million trees in the next ten years. It's funded by the government's Green Recovery Challenge Fund.

FACT: Every £1 spent on tree planting saves the UK £7 in healthcare, energy and environmental costs. (treesforstreets.gov)

With the scheme, residents can request a tree to be planted in their street by making an online sponsorship donation via the council's website.

There are two ways to do this:



- 1. Sponsor a tree and water it regularly. A donation of £230 to plant a new tree.
- 2. Sponsor a tree, which the *council* will take the responsibility for watering

A donation of £320 to plant and look after a new tree. \star

The Green Spaces team will assess the location, and if it's suitable, arrange to plant the tree this winter - the best planting time to ensure young trees thrive. If unsuitable, they will advise on an alternative nearby location.



Celebration trees: As part of a sister scheme, Hillingdon residents can sponsor trees to be planted in the borough's parks and green spaces. Eg to mark celebrations and positive life moments, such as weddings, anniversaries and graduations, so that each tree has its own, happy story.

Now in the second year of its three-year programme, the scheme has so far seen more than 230 Hillingdon residents helping to plant trees across the borough.

Buckingham Palace "Tree of Trees" Sculpture



Junior Foresters helped to plant 350 trees to form a massive 70ft living sculpture, to mark the Queen's 70 years' reigning as our monarch. 80 steel branches supported the 350 trees, each one in an aluminium pot bearing the Queen's cypher.

It reflects the planting of more than a million Jubilee trees as part of the Queen's Green Canopy (QGC) initiative. LED lights were threaded through the young trees, with the structure switched on by Her Majesty to serve as the principal beacon during the Jubilee celebrations.



Designer Thomas Heatherwick stated: "This sculpture sends one simple, eternal message: that trees are the superheroes of our towns and cities and matter much more to our lives than we realise."

After the celebrations end, and the sculpture is deconstructed, all the trees will be distributed throughout Britain, with 14 being donated to London for to individuals and organisations in recognition of their work for the

community. It is hoped that the OGC will inspire the next generation of tree planters.

What to do if there's persistent dog fouling

Dog fouling is one of the most offensive types of litter on our streets and in our green spaces.

It can be dangerous for humans to come into contact with dog excrement, as it can lead to blindness from an infection called *Toxocara canis*.

Since 1996, legislation has specified that it is an offence to allow your dog to foul in public areas and not to clean up after them. This includes roads, pathways, parks and playing fields.



Report it to Hillingdon Council

The council has a responsibility to clear dog fouling or mess from the public highway as part of normal street cleaning. Reporting persistent incidents helps the council take effective action to stop this kind of activity. But catching offenders in the act is difficult, so information from the public identifying who the offender is (if known) is vital and should be collected before a report is made to the council.

If you see or believe that someone is regularly allowing their dog to foul on the road, pavement or verge, it would be really helpful if you could keep a diary noting down the exact location and time of occurrences over, say, a 2-week period.

In your report, please ensure you include the exact location of the fouling, provide a name and address, or description of the dog owner and dog and the frequency of it happening. **Report via the website www.hillingdon.gov.uk.**

Owner responsibilities

- Dog owners must keep their pet under control at all times.
- There are signs in parks and open spaces advising when an animal must be on a lead, and they're not allowed in children's play areas.
- Dog fouling must be disposed of correctly by the owner.
- If you ask someone else to walk the dog, you must make sure they only do so if they are prepared to pick up the dog poo and dispose of it properly.

If you do not pick up after your dog, you may be given a Fixed Penalty Notice fine of £80. Offenders *could* be prosecuted and fined up to £1,000.

A look back in time... Northwood Hills celebrated another Royal Jubilee.



This advertisement appeared in the West Middlesex Gazette on Saturday 6th April 1935, a fortnight ahead of the grand occasion, which was attended by an incredible 150,000 people. The station (which had opened in 1933) would have been teeming with travellers.

This marked the Silver Jubilee of King George V when the King himself spoke to crowds gathered in London on 6^{th} May 1935.

Were there similarities to the recent Platinum Jubilee of Queen Elizabeth 2nd?

These celebrations began with a carriage procession through London to St. Paul's Cathedral for a Thanksgiving Service. It was followed by another procession back to Buckingham Palace, shown in the photograph below with King George and Queen Mary:

The Royal Family appeared on the balcony. Due to popular demand, the King waved from the same balcony for a few consecutive days. The Jubilee Day was declared a bank holiday and across the country there were garden parties, pageants and sports events.



The Jubilee was also marked with a ball for two thousand guests at Buckingham Palace on 14th May, an Empire Exhibition and the State Opening of Parliament.

...Look at our 1935 "Jubilee Path" today!

Planting an avenue (double row) of trees was part of our tribute to the Silver Jubilee for George V, marking 25 years' reign as the King of England and Emperor of India. Sadly, the King died from pneumonia less than a year later at the age of 70.

The houses were still being built

Northwood Hills homes were still being constructed, but those on Highland Road and Cranbourne Road must have been mapped out as the path hugs their back gardens and the metal fencing which borders St Vincent's field.

Symbolism of the trees

When planted the trees would have been saplings. Now they are magnificent. The two tree types may have been chosen for their symbolic meanings.



London Plane trees on the lefthand side have distinctive "camouflage" look bark, massive leaves, up to 25cms and denote: Sovereignty, Permanence, Greatness and Superiority.



Lime trees on the right-hand side with their beautifully scented, delicate flowers in June and heart-shaped leaves denote: Fidelity, Justice and Love.

The Jubilee Walk has been cleared and reinstated for lovely shady walks by volunteers from the Friends of Northwood Recreation Ground. In addition, with the help of Hillingdon Council, two new "scrape lakes" have been made and planted with wildflowers to try and capture water seeping from underground water-courses and avoid the previously boggy conditions in that corner of the plaving field. For comparison with other London Boroughs: Slough's population is up by 13%, Hounslow's is up 13.5% and Tower Hamlets has increased the most, by 22%.

Space per person In England, on average there are three people for every football pitch-sized piece of land (FP).



Spacious Hillingdon is the third least densely populated of the 33 London local authorities with 19 people living per FP.

It ranks 43rd for total population out of 309 local authority areas in England, moving up four places since 2011.



Tower Hamlets is most densely populated with 112 people per FP.



By contrast, Cumbria is least populated with 5 FP's per person!

Aging Population In 2021, the largest age group in both the UK and London was 30 to 34 years. Ten years ago, 25-29 years was the largest group.

Overall, in England there has been an increase of 20.1% in people aged 65 years and over. In Hillingdon there has been an increase of 17.4% in this age-group. Milton Keynes has the largest increase (up by 43%).

Hillingdon also has 10.4% more residents for ages 15 to 64 years, and 12.9% more children aged under 15 years.



More data is expected to be released by the Office of National Statistics, with Phase Two information being released from October onwards. We will pass this on in our next issue.

I trained in the art of drafting Wills in 2007 and over the years have come across all manner of situations with my clients that needed different solutions within the Will and as such I like to ensure the Will I draft is specific to my client's needs.

Most of the Will writing industry simply feed information into a software package on their computers which churns out a standard Will, which often does not accommodate the client's true wishes.

I feel a Will should be easy for the people who are both executing and benefiting from the Will to understand. A lot of the wording in the computergenerated Wills is unnecessary and often confusing and the client's wishes are not catered for.

I draft Wills that are both legally binding, but also clear and easy to understand and mirror exactly what my client wants, not what the computer states. (I do access the computer software and am aware of the wording it has for its Wills, but prefer to draft my Wills bespoke to suit the client).

I like to cover every possible eventuality that could occur in the client's lifetime, thus avoiding the need to make unnecessary changes in the future.

I consider property protection as a very important part of a Will's make-up, as well as deciding who inherits if a named beneficiary dies. Deciding where any potential inheritance is paid from is also vitally important, so there is no confusion when the time comes should the payment of inheritance tax be necessary.

If my client has a certain possession, for example a wedding ring, which more than one beneficiary may want after my client dies, stating who receives it is again very important to avoid any arguments when the time comes.

There could be someone that my client does not want to inherit and therefore who they want to exclude from their Will, but who later may make a claim against the Will once my client has died. In this case, I always ensure a special letter of wishes is compiled to explain the reasons for the exclusion should the matter go to court. My client may own a business, in which case I can explain how this can be gifted inheritance tax free within the will.

To make life easy for my clients I offer a free home visit, so they can explain to me exactly what they want to happen to their assets when they die and, of course, who they want and who they don't want to have them and in what shares.

I can then advise on the advantages a Will can offer and also explain how the use of Trusts (if necessary) within a Will can help give control over their assets after death.

Once I have taken my client's instructions, I can then draft them a copy of their Will which I send to them for checking. If any mistakes are made, or they want to amend any part of the Will, I re draft the Will and resend it to them. Once they are happy with the draft, I print it off and bind it, then arrange to bring it round to them to ensure it is signed, dated and witnessed correctly.

Although the initial home visit is free, I do have a charge for the drafting and signing of the Will: A single simple Will..... = $\pounds 60$ A single Will with additional Trusts etc = $\pounds 120$ Simple mirror Wills (for a couple) = $\pounds 100$ Mirror Wills with additional Trusts etc = $\pounds 160$ No matter how complex a Will, my prices never go above these prices.

If required, I can also be a person's Certificate provider and prepare Lasting Power of Attorney forms for them. My fee is £70 per LPA Also, if required, I can arrange for clients to transfer assets (usually their property) into a Lifetime Asset Allocation Trust, this procedure involves using a firm with solicitors to draft the Trusts, so the cost is £890

Finally, over the years I have been asked to help with the administration of clients' Wills when they have died, so I also offer a free Probate consultancy service to help the executors and beneficiaries of the Will during this sad time. In addition, if they find the forms difficult to prepare, I can fill them in on their behalf for a fee of £70



Fascinating Facts about Hair

Even before we choose our own style and cut, our smooth and straight to big and bouncy hair is as unique as the person it belongs to, in colour and texture. It goes through changes throughout life according to our own preferences, health and even lifestyle.

- \circ The average person has 100,000 150,000 strands of hair.
- $\circ~$ On average, you shed around 50-150 strands of hair a day and regrow the same number.
- $\circ~$ A healthy strand of hair can stretch an additional 30% when it's wet.
- $\circ~$ At times, 90% of hair is growing, while the other 10% is resting.
- Each stand has its own muscle, called the erector pili muscle. When we are cold or scared, goosebumps occur when it contracts.
- o A single hair has a lifespan of about five years.
- A hair strand is stronger than a copper wire with the same diameter.
- Hair is made up of mostly keratin, the same substance that makes up most of our fingernails, horses' hooves and tails.
- In rare cases, hair may suddenly turn white. This condition is known as Marie Antoinette Syndrome, whose hair reportedly went grey overnight before her beheading.
- People have been colouring their hair for thousands of years using plants and minerals such as henna, black walnut shells or bleaching with vinegar.



Curly or Straight? The shaft of your hair affects the way protein molecules build up. Eg. proteins such as keratins build up unevenly in curly hair, But the shape of the follicle is even more influential as to whether your hair is straight or curly. Round, hair will tend to grow straight; oval will give waves and an elliptical-shape gives you curly hair.

Colour. Two melanin pigments (eu-melanin and pheo-melanin) affect hair colour according to how they are balanced. Eumelanin is a dark pigment for brown and black hair. Everyone has the reddish pheomelanin pigment that results in ginger and strawberry blond hair types.



Grey hair and genetics. Our genes determine what age we go grey, and gene one variant is specifically a marker for premature greying.

Pregnancy. Some women report that their hair became thicker and glossier and light hair can darken due to higher levels of hormones oestrogen and progesterone.

Blonde children sometimes get darker hair at around seven or eight and have dark hair in adulthood as melanin production increases.

Health issues can contribute to premature greying. For example, autoimmune thyroid disease, vitiligo, and ageing syndromes.

Smoking. A 2013 study suggested that smoking, like air pollution, generates unstable oxygen molecules that damage the biochemical process of melanin production.

Medication can alter natural hair colour. Certain drugs used to prevent malaria can lighten hair, while some epilepsy drugs can darken it.

Some cancer treatments can inhibit receptors on the follicles. That's why some people who have had chemo-therapy may notice their hair grows back curly once treatment has finished.

Stress can cause greying of hair or loss. Loss of hair in clumps is called alopecia areata. Depending on the extent of hair loss there is a good chance that, for 4 out of 5 affected people, complete regrowth will occur within 1 year without treatment.

Lifestyle such as smoking, poor diet, washing hair with hot water, tight pony-tails, heat and chemical treatment can all damage hair follicles, resulting in hair loss more quickly.



Why Do Men Go Bald? Largely a hereditary genetic condition, it may be caused by dihydrotestosterone (DHT) which is a male hormone which makes hair follicles shrink.

Even Animals change their hair colour



Some animals change their hair colour twice a year! Snowshoe hares are pure white in the winter, helping them hide in snow. In summer, they switch to a darker coat, so they are camouflaged all year.

Enjoy the twinkling lights, wrapping up warm and eating our own body weight in chocolate. But it's also the time of year when our pointless plastic footprints go through the roof. Even when we manage to avoid buying plastic presents, shops bombard us with plastic at every turn – satsumas in plastic nets, shiny wrapping paper and a lot of glitter.

So, this festive season let's make sure to take time to get creative and avoid excess plastic. We can all do our bit.

Think about one or two of these ideas:

1. Gift wrapping

Save wrapping paper from gifts received to re-use on presents for other people. Even patchwork can be fun! Shiny wrapping paper often cannot be recycled. Instead, try plain paper decorated with fabric ribbon or children's drawings? Consider re-usable pillowcases (bought cheaply from charity shops) which can be used again and again.

2. Decking the halls

Don't change the bauble and decoration colour every year – instead keep and re-use them over and again, like old friends. Avoid foil lametta strands and fake snow. Unfortunately, they turn into microplastics that enter the food chain.

Make your own wreath from greenery, paper, dried orange slices, home-made ring biscuits, card, origami,



ribbon, corks or fallen fir tree cones. Set aside a day (with or without the kids) to enjoy making your own decorations, there are loads of ideas online.

3. Don't forget the reusable shopping bags

Remember to take reusable shopping bags this shopping season. Remind yourself with a note on your front door on the way out or a phone alert – whatever works for you! Fold-away bags can be kept in a bag or pocket. And there are lots of lovely designs suitable for presents too!

4. Choose plastic-free presents


Avoid single use bottled presents such as fancy potions and lotions, which are also often ridiculously over-packaged at Christmas. Think about "experience" presents. Make home-made puddings, jams and pickles, or flavoured gins for the grown-ups. Ask for your own presents to be pre-owned and bought from charity shops. Great for the environment and the charity.

5. Tone down the glitter

Popular though it is, glitter is not good news for the environment. It's effectively tiny pieces of plastic, which may start on cards and decorations, but can end up being washed down the sink. These eventually end up in our rivers and oceans.

4. Avoid disposable cutlery for extra diners

An increase in guests may prompt the use of plastic cutlery or plates. Consider asking one of your guests or a neighbour if you can borrow some from them to boost capacity. Or wash cutlery between courses.



6. Refreshments on the move

If travelling to visit friends and family, prepare for the journey by taking re-usable coffee/tea-cups. Around 2.5 billion disposable coffee cups are thrown away every year in the UK and less than one in 400 are recycled. Consider giving one as a gift! Take tap water and drinks with you, instead of buying bottled water and drinks. Avoid using plastic straws, although more are now being made from paper, and take your own re-usable "Sporks" to use.

8. Ditch the plastic fruit and veg

Supporting your local greengrocers or market stalls can be a great way to reduce your plastic usage and support local businesses. Buy loose fruit and veg, no need to put it into disposable plastic bags. Paper bags are often supplied for mushrooms. Or re-use lightweight net bags. Buying loose items may also reduce food waste, as you can buy only what you need.

The UK produces more plastic waste per person than almost every other country in the world – 2nd only to the US. We can't cope with the amount of plastic waste that companies are producing, so British plastic is getting dumped overseas and burned in the open air, creating serious health problems for local people and harming wildlife.

If we all make just a few small changes, it would have a big impact on the amount of plastic we use across the nation. Jan C **Northwood Football Club News**

London Fire Brigade Hillingdon 2020: 813 fires

Did you know that we attend on average 24 fires each week that have been started by **chargers**, **batteries and cables?**

28 September 2021. Shop fire – Northwood. Call out 00:03, fire under control by 02:04

Four fire engines from Ruislip, Harrow and Hertfordshire and around 25 firefighters were called to a fire at a shop with flats above on Maxwell Road in Northwood. Part of the ground-floor shop was damaged by fire. One person left a first-floor flat above the shop before the Brigade arrived. There were no reports of any injuries.

Cause: A lithium-ion battery for a golf buggy.

An essential part of daily life, are batteries dangerous?

When used properly, no. But batteries can present a fire risk when over-charged, short-circuited, submerged in water, or damaged. It's really important to charge them safely too. Lithium-ion batteries or li-ion batteries (sometimes called LIBs) are the lightweight, rechargeable batteries that power our phones, laptops and cameras. They're found in devices from mobility scooters to e-cigarettes, and are used safely by millions of people every day. However, there are some things you need to know when it comes to fire safety, chargers and batteries.

Firefighter safety tips for charging your devices:

- Always use the charger that came with your phone, tablet, e-cigarette or mobile device.
- If you need to buy a replacement, always choose a branded, genuine product from a supplier you can trust. There are lots of fakes out there, and it can be difficult to spot the difference.
- Never cover chargers or charging devices that includes using your laptop power lead in bed.

What may seem like a bargain, isn't worth the risk when you consider that it could cost your life!

- Avoid storing, using or charging batteries at very high or low temperatures.
- Protect batteries against being damaged that's crushed, punctured or immersed in water.



• Don't overload your sockets with too much power load.

Don't leave items continuously on charge after the charge cycle is complete – it's best not to leave your phone plugged in overnight, for example.

Other facts:

- There are over 1,200 cooking-related fires and false alarms in London's university student halls. Make sure students in the family know safety basics.
- On average, a third of all call-outs are to false alarms, largely caused by poorly maintained fire detectors. While firefighters are responding to false alarms, they are not available to tackle real fires, putting lives at risk.



You are twice as likely to die in a house fire that has no smoke alarm than one that does. Annually, there are about 50,000 fires in the home (140 a day), killing nearly 500 and injuring over 11,000 people. Many deaths could have been prevented if people had an early warning and were able to get out in time.

Christmas Safety:

- If replacing fuses on Christmas lights, never exceed the maximum fuse recommended.
- If bulbs blow, replace them.
- Don't leave fairy lights on when you go out, or go to sleep.
- Don't let the bulbs touch anything that can burn easily, like paperwrapped presents or decorations.
- Never hang decorations to lights or heaters, nor around a lit fireplace.
- Place candles sensibly and never leave them alight in an unoccupied room.
